Ms. Poonam Mishra (Head Mistress, Sr. Section); and Ms. Batul Lamba (Head Mistress, Jr. Section), attended a 3-day Prospective Resource Person Programme by CBSE, titled 'Leading Transformation for Principals', from 21st to 23rd of May. It was hosted by Army Public School, at NDA, Khadakwasla.

It was an enriching and highly interactive workshop, which focused on transforming schools through effective leadership and innovative practices. The sessions emphasized developing vision into meaningful action for continuous school improvement, and understanding the role of schools in building healthy partnerships with parents, teachers, students, and the community. The workshop also highlighted the concept of schools as learning organisations where collaboration, reflection, and continuous growth are encouraged.

Important areas such as health and wellness, self-assessment, happy organisations, and various CBSE initiatives were discussed in depth.

Through group discussions, case studies, activities, and experience sharing, principals reflected on the everyday challenges they face in school administration and explored practical ways to handle them effectively. The programme provided a valuable platform for collaborative learning, self-reflection, and leadership development, making the sessions meaningful, engaging, and inspiring.

TEACHER LEARNERS



The Kalyani School teachers attended a two-day Capacity Building training session on 29th and 30th of May, conducted by CBSE on the topics Strengthening Assessment, Experiential Learning and Adolescent Education. The Board constantly endeavours to evolve in keeping with the changing needs of the hour, and to make sure that the students are able to acquire the required levels of competency and skills. This necessitates the teachers to be upgraded and trained in the essential pedagogical skills, and TKS makes sure that the teachers are always up to date with all the latest developments adopted by CBSE.

The training focused on skill development, curriculum goals, learning outcomes, and the alignment of Educational Learning Outcomes (ELOs) with classroom practices. Participants gained insights into portfolio assessment, question paper design, assessment and evaluation techniques, and the application of Bloom's Taxonomy for creating competency-based questions. The sessions on experiential learning, highlighted the importance of activity-based and learner-centric approaches. The programme also covered learning domains, multiple intelligences, and sample classroom activities that promote critical thinking, creativity, and holistic development. The adolescent education component addressed key issues such as healthy body image, adolescent needs, understanding sexual orientation with sensitivity and respect, and strategies for coping with stress. These sessions emphasized the role of teachers in fostering a safe, inclusive, and supportive learning environment.

The programme was highly informative and interactive, equipping participants with practical tools and strategies to improve classroom engagement, assessment practices, and student well-being.
